Proof of Income:

Printouts from: public aid, social security, unemployment, food stamp printout, link card, check stub, or medical card.

Verification of Address:

Current utility bill and/or government mail showing Will County address

Any child attending fair MUST be accompanied by an adult. If parent/guardian is unable to attend the fair, their adult representative must bring all documentation noted above for the absent parent and children.
